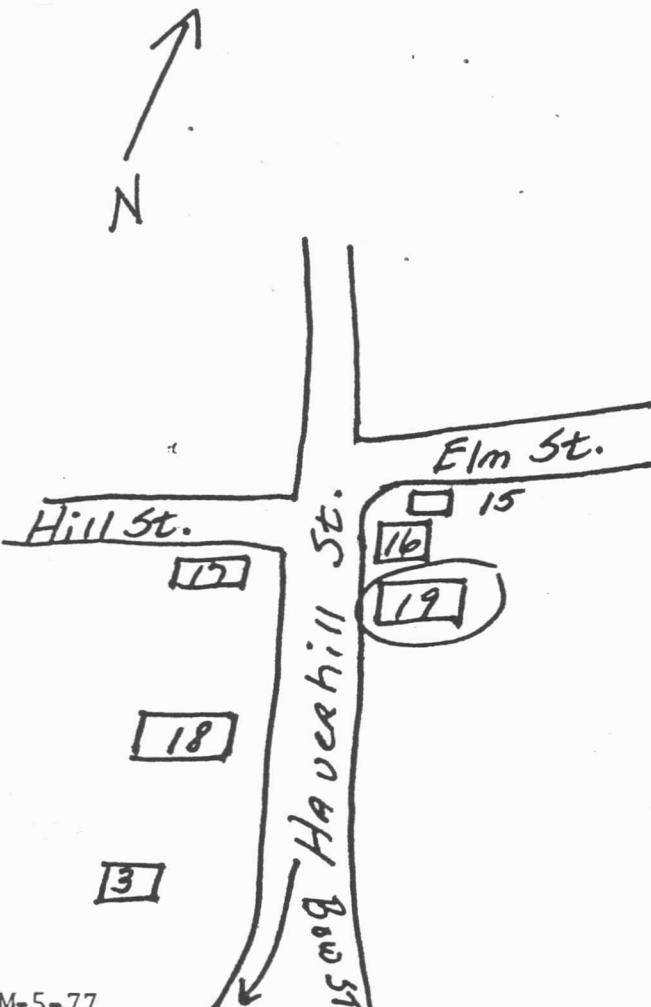

Lydia Matilda (Jones) Stone was the second wife of Eliab Stone IV, a great-grandson of Rev. Eliab Stone, second minister of Reading's North Parish, and a descendant of early settler John Upton, the originator of the name in this country. After the death of her husband, Mrs. Stone had this home built and moved from the Elm Street Upton-Stone homestead to the center of town. Just before her second marriage, she conveyed the property to their daughter, Della Frances (Stone) and her husband Charles H. Turner lived here until their death and the house was sold in 1940.
